Information held about you

The types of data we will process for providing care and support for vulnerable individuals and their families are:

- Name
- Address
- Date of birth
- Gender
- Next of Kin
- Disability
- Daily records
- Health needs
- Covid-19 information
- Incidents and accidents
- Any other information that may be relevant to the purposes outlined above

Safeguarding adults

Hoople Ltd responds to concerns raised regarding adults who may be unable to protect themselves from abuse or harm due to the nature of their care and support needs. Practitioners aim to support people to keep safe and prevent harm or abuse from occurring or reoccurring.

Deprivation of liberty

To work with adults who lack capacity to consent to care and treatment and are, placed in residential care or in hospital and are deprived of their liberty due to the nature of care and/or treatment they are receiving. Practitioners determine whether this deprivation is proportionate and necessary to ensure the person is protected from unnecessary restrictions to their freedom of movement.

Mental Health Act 1983 (2007)

Approved mental health professionals are practitioners who have specialist skills and act on behalf of the council to carry out assessments under the Mental Health Act 1983 (2007), to determine whether people need to be admitted to hospital due to their mental health needs.

Who is processing your data

Herefordshire Council is the data controller under data protection law, and Hoople Ltd is the data processor acting on behalf of Herefordshire Council.

How we will use the information we hold about you?

We will use the information you provide in order to:

- Collect and process personal information to provide learning disabilities residential and respite services to individuals with care and support needs
- Establish if an adult is in need of support to keep themselves safe and prevent harm or abuse
- Establish if a person is deprived of their liberty and if so, whether this is both proportionate and in their best interests











- Establish if a person requires admission to hospital for treatment of their health needs
- Support adults in managing their desired outcomes
- Plan and commission services

What is the Legal Basis for us to process your data?

The legal basis for processing this data is:

- Article 6(1)(d): the processing is necessary to protect someone's life.
- Article 6(1)(e): the processing is necessary to perform a task in the public interest or for our official functions, and the task or function has a clear basis in law.
- Article 9(2)h: processing is necessary for the purposes of preventive or occupational medicine, for the assessment of the working capacity of the employee, medical diagnosis, the provision of health or social care or treatment or the management of health or social care systems and services, on the basis of Union or Member state laws.

Hoople Ltd's legal obligations under the Care Act 2014

- For the performance of a task carried out in the public interest or in the exercise of official authority
- To protect someone's vital interests
- For special category data, for medical diagnosis, the provision of health or social care treatment or the management of health and social care systems

The main legislation that provides us with the statutory basis to deliver our services are:

Who we will share your information with

We will ensure that any personal data in our care will be kept safe and that where your information is disclosed to a third party, we will seek to ensure that the third party has sufficient systems and procedures in place to prevent the loss or damage of personal data.

How long we keep your personal information

We will keep your data for 8 years after the termination of service. All information will be held securely and destroyed under confidential conditions.

Your rights
